**Motion:** To add to the comment letter that hazardous materials burned in the fire, and that the City should not let toxic materials remain in the ground. Enough soil should be removed to allow for certainty that no toxic materials remain.

Moved by Ellen; seconded by Tim. Approved unanimously.

### 7. Discussion and Possible Motion

Review motions in the 25-0006 Council File series and mayoral orders related to debris removal and assess whether BABCNC will provide feedback, and devise the substance of any feedback.

**Motion:** To comment that the debris removal process needs to be carried out with transparency and attention to equity. Proceedings of the Debris Removal Task Force should be public. Trees should be preserved to the greatest extent possible, and personnel carrying out debris removal should receive pertinent training to allow this to happen. Moved by Ellen; seconded by Tim. Passed unanimously.

# 8. Discussion and Possible Motion

Review motions in the 25-0006 Council File series related to staffing for recovery efforts, assess whether BABCNC will provide feedback, and devise the substance of any feedback.

**Motion:** To comment that City Departments should provide an assessment of labor needs and a schedule of hiring and training that's mindful of budgetary concerns. Moved by Ellen; seconded by Stella. Passed unanimously.
